

CVQG Block of the Month – February 2026

This block is intended to be scrappy! But you do have the option to use only 3 fabrics.

The background fabric B should be white, white-on-white, or light beige.

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A – (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " sq  This $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square can be made from (4) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, each a different fabric, sewn together.

Fabric B – (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 18" piece Plus (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" piece

Subcut the (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 18" piece into (4) pieces cut into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, and 

Subcut the (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" piece into (12) pieces cut into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares 

Fabric C – (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10" piece Plus (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" piece

Subcut the (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10" piece into (4) pieces cut into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares 

Subcut the (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" piece into (8) pieces cut into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles 

OR to make it scrappy:

(4) pieces cut into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

Each square should be a different fabric.

(8) pieces cut into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

Each rectangle should be a different fabric.

Note: The green color block used for Fabric C is only representative of the shapes/sizes of the fabric(s) used in that position in the block. As noted above, fabrics of different colors and designs can/should be used.

Note: Sew the units using a SCANT $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam.

Step 1. Make four flying geese units using (1) fabric C - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and (2) fabric B - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Mark a diagonal line on the back of 4 of the B - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Place the B square on the narrow edge ($2\frac{1}{2}$ ") of the C - $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle. [Make certain the diagonal is running in the correct direction.] Sew the B square onto the C rectangle on the drawn line. Repeat with a 2nd B square on the other narrow edge of the C rectangle. Sew along the drawn line. Trim the excess B fabric keeping $\frac{1}{4}$ " beyond the sewn seam.

Repeat to create four B-C-B units.

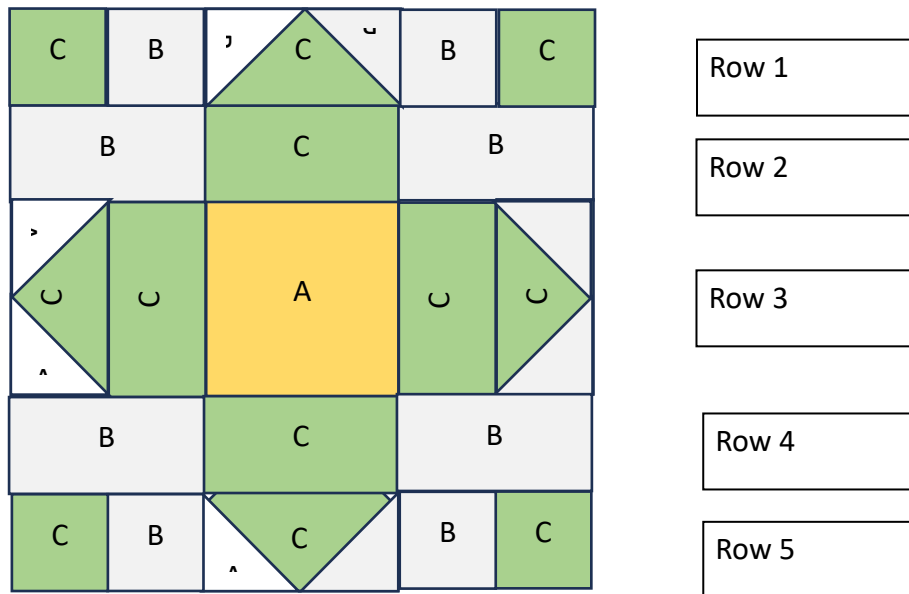

Step 2. Lay the blocks out as shown in Diagram 2.

Step 3. Sew the blocks in Row 1 together, followed by Rows 2 through 5.

Step 4. Sew Row 1 to Row 2, then add Row 3, then add Row 4, and finally add Row 5.

Step 5. Trim the block to 12 ½" square.

Step 6. Turn in at the Block of the Month table at the February 14, 2026 meeting.
