Lay the blocks out in 3 rows with 2 blocks per row.
Now for the sashing from Part 4 -
In each row use 3 of the Part $4 a$ units (vertical sashing) to add one to either side and one in the middle of the row of two blocks. Repeat for the other two rows. You now have three rows to put together with horizontal sashing.

Use the Part 4b units (horizontal sashing) to sew the rows together. Add one unit to the top of the quilt and one unit to the bottom of the quilt.
