Hello Everyone!

Where has the summer gone? It seems like we were just wrapping up our first Studio Tour and now it is time to get ready for our meeting in September.

The Studio Tour was wonderful thanks to the organization done by Pat Siegel, Natalie Shonerd, Andrea Dooley and Cheryl Jensen AND the special group of guild members who opened their studios and their homes to our members. All the members who I talked to that attended the tour were delighted with it. We hope to do this again in a couple of years.

After two months away, I am looking forward to some great programs beginning in September. Check the newsletter or on the website for details of these programs. In November Monica Gonzalez will be joining us for a Houston Market Update. We finish the year with the Holiday Party. Watch for details about the party and start thinking of getting a group together to create a raffle basket and making something for the silent auction. Not too early to start (and then keep going with making items for the boutique at the Quilt Show in March.)

The next six months or so are filled with shows that are local. The La Quinta Arts Foundation is sponsoring numerous activities for American Craft Week (the week of October 5) including a three month exhibit of quilts from members of our guild at La Quinta Civic Center. They are holding a reception on Wednesday, October 7 from 4pm to 6pm at the Civic Center that will include a free lecture by Laura Wasilowski, an international art quilter. See the newsletter for further information. The original series of the Day of the Dead quilts will be on display along with other quilts.

The Day of the Dead Cards done by guild members will be on display in October at the Palm Springs Art Museum. You can check them out when you are in Palm Springs for QuiltFest Oasis — October 8 and 9 — at the Palm Springs Convention Center.

November brings the Art Affaire in Rancho Mirage on November 7 & 8 (yes, that is a guild day but. . .) where we have done a display and sold Opportunity Quilt tickets for the last few years. Maybe you would like to help out or just come by and say hello. Watch for details at the guild meetings.

Finally, when 2016 comes around there will be the Date Festival in February and the Desert Guilds Quilt Show in March. Please think about entering quilts in both of these shows and volunteering to sell Opportunity Quilt tickets or various other jobs at our show in March. Your help is what makes the guild run smoothly.

Also beginning in January 2016 we will be starting up classes again on the Sundays following our meetings. We had some wonderful classes last year but attendance was low. The Board decided to lower the cost of the class to \$25 to encourage more people to attend. Start signing up in September because those classes will fill fast.

#### Follow the Thread—A Salute to American Craft Week

Sept. 8 - Nov. 20, 2015 at La Quinta Community Gallery

La Quinta Arts Foundation and the City of La Quinta, in association with Coachella Valley Quilt Guild, will co-present an exhibition of contemporary quilt art at La Quinta Community Gallery in La Quinta Civic Center, 78495 Calle Tampico, La Quinta. The exhibit will run from September 8<sup>th</sup> through November 20<sup>th</sup>. The gallery will be open to the public Monday through Friday, 10 am to 4 pm.

Follow the Thread is a glimpse into the fascinating world of modern-day quilt artists who are able to transform a fabric canvas into a multi-faceted art piece by imagining the possibilities contained in a bolt of fabric and a spool of thread. Quilt artists are continually pushing the boundaries of this medium as they explore new directions for this American craft.

The exhibition will feature 27 extraordinary art quilts plus 11 "tree sculptures" created by 23 local quilt artists. Nine of the quilts on display will pay homage to Dia de los Muertos (the Day of the Dead) — all inspired by the children's book, Calavera Abecedario, by Jeanette Winter, a Day of the Dead alphabet book.

A highlight of the exhibit will be a unique mixed technique quilt by Laura Peterson simply titled, "The Quilt Show." The quilt measuring 108"x30" is on special loan from Big Fork, Montana.

Please join us on **Wednesday**, **October 7**<sup>th</sup> from 4 to 5 pm in City Council Chambers for a special guest lecture by **Laura Wasilowski**, one of the star instructors at Quilt Oasis Palm Springs 2015, who will give a presentation featuring selections of her quilt art. Following the lecture will be a gallery reception from 5 to 6 pm. This event is presented in partnership with Quilt Oasis Palm Springs, held October 8-10, 2015 at Palm Springs Convention Center.

Laura Wasilowski is a renowned textile artist, author, teacher, and creator of hand dyed fabrics and threads who resides in Illinois. She has an undergraduate degree in Costuming from the College of St. Benedict, St. Joseph, MN and a Master of Art degree in Fiber from Northern Illinois University, DeKalb, IL. She is owner of *ARTFABRIK*.

#### Annual Day of the Dead Celebration - Palm Springs Museum

As part of Palm Springs Art Museum's annual *Day of the Dead / Día de los muertos* celebration, the museum will be displaying the *Day of the Dead Deck of Cards* during the month of October. These quilts were created by 23 of our guild members who were challenged to make an art quilt based on the playing card they chose (Aces, Jokers and face cards) but with the twist that it had to reflect the Day of the Dead influence. This challenge was inspired by the show and book, "Art Quilts: Playing With a Full Deck".

#### **Health Expo**

The Coachella Valley Quilt Guild received an invitation to be a vendor at the County of Riverside Health Expo, a public awareness event held August 13<sup>th</sup> at the Palm Springs Family Care Center. Because of the support we provide the County's Office on Aging's Senior Care Transition Program, we were honored to be a representative at this Health Expo. Other vendors included Senergy Home Care, Mizell Senior Center in Palm Springs, First 5 Riverside (Department of Mental Health), Gentiva Hospice plus many others.

We raffled a beautiful fall themed quilt created by one of our members. The winner was Jackie Fernandez, a Certified Medical Assistant, who works at the Family Care Center. She was very excited to have won the quilt and said her husband would be so surprised and happy for her. We were delighted to present the quilt to her.

# **Annual Retreats**

Temecula is about 1.5 hours from the Valley and is located in the wine country. Due to the popularity of the retreat center, we have a limit to the number of rooms available, which limits the number of guilters we can accommodate.

Our winter retreat is scheduled for Thursday, November 19-22. This is a change from the original date. We discovered that the original date fell on our guild meeting. Our tradition is to have the retreat annually on the 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend in November. The retreat worked hard and was able to confirm us on our usual 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend. The cost of this retreat is a little higher than the summer retreat.
