Our Opportunity Quilt has not seen much action since June. That is about to change as the summer comes to an end!

The Mancuso Quilt Show in Palm Springs, Quiltfest Oasis 2016 is scheduled October 6 -8, 2016. Show hours are Thursday-Saturday 10am-6pm. As in past years we have requested from the show administers to sell tickets at the show on all 3 days from 10am to 6pm. I have a small list of possible volunteers that signed up in May. I have or will be contacting these volunteers to assure their availability. Before we can sell tickets we need to offer 24 hours of volunteer "white glove" services. Our volunteer day is Friday Oct. 7. We will supply the white gloves and no experience is needed. You are assigned an area of the show to assist visitors in looking at the back of the quilts and answering questions. If we have 12 white glove volunteers each volunteer will do 2 hours. There are chairs available to a rest period and you do not need to stand for the full 2 hours. I am leaving town for 2 months as of Labor Day. Karon Patterson will have the opportunity quilt and will be the contact person for volunteers for the show.

Thank you for supporting the Guild's effort to sell tickets. It helps us in our charitable endeavors and it allows us to have expert speakers and teachers available to us at meetings and workshops.

All members are encouraged to purchase at least \$10 worth of tickets. The tickets will be for sale at our meeting each month.

WANTED: Quilts of Valor

In September 2018, our speaker, Suzanne Wade, will be speaking on the Quilts of Valor program. She is donating her time to share information on this nationwide program. As a thank you for this donation, it has been suggested that we present her with one or two quilts (or more) which can be used in the program and given to veterans.

The guild is looking for individuals or friendship groups which would be willing to make a Quilt of Valor following the programs guidelines. One stipulations is that the quilt "is to be large enough to cover an average-sized adult, with an ideal size approximately 60" x 80." Finished size can be no smaller than 55" x 65" and no larger than 72" x 90"." Please talk to Kathleen Herring or Christina Smithberg if you are interested in this project.
