Winter is a wonderful time to make gifts for others, a time for reflection on your personal goals, and a time to check out your passion quilting, fabrics, and threads. What are your goals this year? Try something new, challenge yourself to finish UFO's, or perfect a sewing skills?

Now is the time to sign up for a class with national quilters.

January 13 Candy Glendening will capture your attention with her fascinating lecture, "From Traditional to Art Quilting". Candy has several DVD's on Thread Sketching. She has written articles for Quilting Arts Magazine, and taped shows for Quilting Arts. She teaches online, AND in her studio in Redlands. For the CVQ workshop (Jan. 14, 9-3), make several quilt sandwiches, so you will be already to learn how to perfect your free motion sketching to include plants, and birds...She will take you from basic free motion design into unique, and very special images. You may make a motif perfect for a pillow, or you might make a small booklet to create memories through new design. Class is \$35. (Booklet kit available)

February 11-12 Sadly Frieda Anderson has cancelled on us. Those who have signed up for her class will be refunded and we will let you know as soon as we have a new program.

March 11-12 is a weekend with Sandy Klop. "The American Jane Story in Fabric"! You will learn about designing fabrics, the business of creating patterns for quilts and her part in the fascinating work of the fabric industry.

Class: "Stars at Play" piecing techniques...you could make a pillow, table runner, or perhaps the whole quilt from her class?? You will need to purchase the pattern. There is some fabric preparation prior to class. Class is Sunday, March 12, from 9 to 3.

April 8, 2017 is the big day for Phyllis Binkley, Art Quilter, from Hemet. She has a show at the San Jose Textile Museum this spring. Phyllis' strength is wool felting. She will teach us about the types of felting, and how to incorporate felted work onto your quilts. Her workshop is Saturday afternoon after the meeting from 1 to 3.
